Why we love this product.

Glaze is a water-based, translucent, and tintable product that has a long open time, which gives you the opportunity to adjust and edit while installing. That also means it's removable up until the finish dries completely, which makes it a friendly product for beginners and pros alike.

Best of all, it's easy to clean!

Important note about glaze.

The opacity (i.e. the amount of color transparency) is wholly dependent on how heavily you apply the product. If you want your finish to pack a punch of color, apply more product. If you wish for the color to be lighter and more subtle, start by applying very little product and build until you reach your desired opacity.

The Steps

Set Up

Lay out all the materials in the box on the drop cloth provided. This is your “set up”.

Dust off base boards & trim around your space. Use the tape in the box to tape off any trim, ceilings, molding, etc. to keep them protected from the glaze. Watch our How To Tape Off video if you want some extra support.

Use the sample board provided to get the hang of the technique before applying the finish to your wall.

If you are using a level to keep the lines straight, now is the time to set those marks on your wall. Either make a full line or tick marks to guide you. Use a light hand and don't draw the line too dark, as they will show through the ChromaGlaze.

Product Application

Let's Get Painting! For the most success, start by choosing a wall that is less of a focal point so you can get the feel for install before moving on to more noticeable areas. Remember, if you get a little crooked, you can simply wipe and redo.

Give the glaze a mix. Using the foam brush, dip it in less than half way, wiping off excess on the side of the jar. No product should be dripping from the brush. Start at the top of your wall and gently tap the end of the brush in a straight line down to the bottom of the wall.

Texture

Next, let's make the WISPS! Taking your 4" chip brush, hold in your hand with the bristles vertically parallel with the wall. Sweep across your ChromaGlaze line in both directions with a straight and steady pull. Let the brush float off the wall leaving light, wispy ends to the stripe.

NOTE: Keep a rag handy so you can wipe off excess product from your 4" chip brush as you move through creating wisps to your stripes.

Repeat

It's best to move through this finish one stripe at a time. Although, you can lay out your leveling or guide lines all at once. It's your choice how closer together or far apart you want your stripes. And, in this finish, irregularity of spacing can be a lot of fun and add extra interest to your space.

Continue laying down the initial ChromaGlaze line with your foam brush and then immediately following up with the chip brush to create the wisps. Remember, if you want to correct a line you can simply wipe the line clean and start over.
